The first day of school for 9th graders is August 21 and 6th graders on August 22. Over the next four years the school will grow to serve grades 6-12. Summit Atlas will be the second Seattle location for Summit Public Schools and its third in the Puget Sound region. Summit Sierra in Seattle's Chinatown-International District and Summit Olympus in Tacoma will serve grades 9-11 in the 2017-18 school year, eventually rolling up to a full 9-12 grade school. All Summit schools are are tuition-free and open to all students.
